Course Content Outline (What Will I study?)	<p>A language GCSE builds on what you've already learnt in years 7, 8 and 9 and you probably know more than you think. By taking a language GCSE you don't just learn the language, you get to find out about other people, countries and cultures so it really is an interesting and varied subject .</p> <p><b><u>Throughout the 2 year course, you will study the following 5 main themes</u></b></p> <p><b><u>Identity and culture</u></b></p> <p>Who am I?: relationships; when I was younger; what my friends and family are like; what makes a good friend; interests; socialising with friends and family; role models.</p> <p>Daily life: customs and everyday life; food and drink; shopping; social media and technology (use of, advantages and disadvantages)</p> <p>Cultural life: celebrations and festivals; reading; music; sport; film and television.</p> <p><b><u>Local area, holiday, travel</u></b></p> <p>Holidays: preferences, experiences and destinations.</p> <p>Travel and tourist transactions: travel and accommodation; asking for help and dealing with problems; directions; eating out; shopping.</p> <p>Town, region and country: weather; places to see; things to do.</p> <p><b><u>School</u></b></p> <p>What school is like: school types; school day; subjects; rules and pressures; celebrating success.</p> <p>School activities: school trips, events and exchanges.</p> <p>Using languages beyond the classroom: forming relationships; travel; employment.</p> <p>Ambitions: further study; volunteering; training.</p> <p>Work: jobs, careers and professions.</p> <p>Future aspirations, study and work.</p> <p><b><u>International and global dimension</u></b></p> <p>Bringing the world together: sports events; music events; campaigns and good causes.</p>
