## YEAR 11 REVISION CHALLENGE

We have launched the Year 11 Revision Challenge to provide structure and support for students in the run-up to their mock exams. The Revision Challenge is the Year 11 homework until after the mock exams. Students will have their homework checked once a week by their class teacher in each subject to ensure they have completed it. This provides flexibility for students to complete subjects on a different day if they are unable to complete the tasks on the day set. Teachers will sign your child's A5 Revision Challenge each week to confirm they have completed it. We have also listened to student feedback and spread the same number of tasks over a longer time, so students have more time to do them.

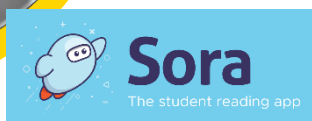

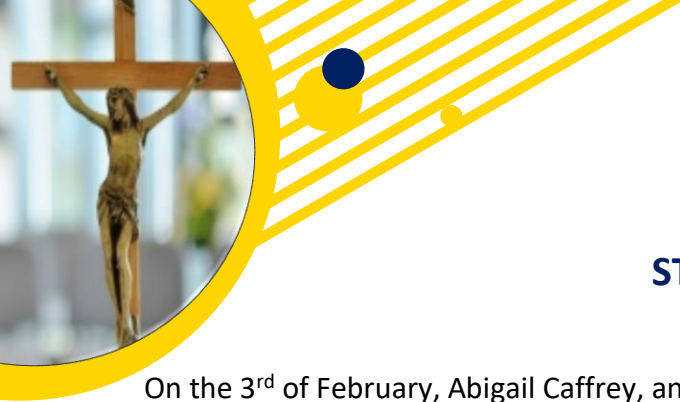
