## STUDENT VOICE UPDATE

On the 10<sup>th</sup> of October, we celebrated World Mental Health Day in many ways, the first of which was our amazing visit from the mental health charity, Kaleidoscope. During break time, energy levels soared when pupils were surprised by the gigantic, mood-boosting dinosaur, Kali, Kaleidoscope's mascot, who aims to break down stigma surrounding mental health, hence their name: The Stigmasaurus.



On this day, we were also so excited to officially launch our #AmIManlyEnough? campaign at our first 'Matrix Morning' of the year. Our campaign aims to break the stigma surrounding male mental health. This involved the 'Am I Manly Enough?' merch drop, where male members of staff and some of our amazing supporters received a pink travel mug with our hashtag, and pink pens promoting the phrase "it's just as hard to be Ken as it is to be Barbie". The idea behind the mugs is that, because they are bright pink, male staff may be questioned on why they have one, because of the stereotype that pink is for girls and blue is for boys. In this way, they act as a conversation starter to explore the topic of male mental health, aiming to break down the stigma.















Alongside this, students could show their support for mental health by wearing a pink and/or yellow ribbon: pink representing their support for male mental health and the yellow ribbon showing support for Young Minds' mental health campaign, 'Hello Yellow'.

Our campaign launch was incredibly well received: many students and staff took pictures with the campaign's new mugs and photo board. However, the greatest reaction to our campaign was from none other than Prince William. About a week before our campaign was launched, Freddie Hadley, Year 8, sent a letter to Prince William on behalf of the Matrix team, inviting him to our launch event. Sadly, he was not able to attend but, after posting the letter to Twitter, he sent a personal reply expressing his apologies:

"Good afternoon Freddie, I'm so sorry Catherine and I can't be with you and the rest of the students at St Michael's today. Tackling mental health challenges and stigmas head on is so important, please keep up this important work. W"

This response was the highlight of the campaign launch - our original tweet now has over 285,000 views, and we are so glad that the campaign is reaching such large audiences to spread awareness about the stereotypes and stigmas surrounding male mental health.

On Wednesday the 11<sup>th</sup> of October, representatives of the Wellbeing Champion and Matrix teams presented at the Youth Suicide Prevention Conference at Villa Park. Attendees and presenters included school senior leaders, medical staff, and business owners. We led workshops surrounding our new male mental health campaign and preventative initiatives we have at school, such as the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Child, Wellbeing Champions, and Feel Good Friday. We also used imagery to spark conversations in small groups and show attendees how we brainstorm ideas for our own events and initiatives.
