# St Michael's Pledge




At St Michael's we all agree that our school is a positive learning environment in which:

- moulded studded boots and or/astro trainers (not metal studs) and basketball boots can only be worn during the specific sporting activity and should be brought into school in a bag












#### **Values – St Michael's Values Cards**

- **Service** to promote the Christian value of service by providing opportunities for our children to make a full and rewarding contribution to the school, local and wider communities.

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

#### Classroom Code of Conduct

- † Line up outside the classroom in single file in the correct uniform.
- † Stand behind chairs until instructed to sit down.
- † Ask permission in order to remove blazers.
- † Ask permission for a drink water only.
- † Do not leave your seat without permission.
- † Do not chew gum.
- † Exit the classroom following the one-way system.







#### Values – St Michael's Guide for Behaviour



#### At St Michael's we are committed to:

- † promoting good behaviour
- † ensuring equality and fairness of treatment for all
- † cheering on and rewarding good behaviour
- † challenging and disciplining poor behaviour
- † providing a safe environment, free from disruption, violence, discrimination, bullying, and any form of harassment
- † promoting a culture of praise and encouragement in which all students can achieve
- † Students are expected to be polite to all members of the school community and to all visitors to the school.
- † Students are reminded that they are representatives of the school at all times and should wear their uniform with pride.

- † Students should be ready always to offer help to others if necessary.
- † Students must attend all lessons and other school activities punctually and always arrive in good time for commitments.
- † Students should take pride in the school environment and keep it tidy.

- † Students must not chew gum.
- † Students must not swear or use offensive language.
- † Vandalism and graffiti on school premises and elsewhere are strictly forbidden.
- † Students must not damage or disfigure the school premises, either inside or outside the buildings.







## **Values – St Michael's Expectations Cards**

St Michael's students are expected to carry these at all times in the top pocket of their blazer. Any student that breaches the standard will have their card signed by a member of staff. Three signatures on a card will result in a detention or further consequence depending the card colour being signed.

The following breaches of behaviour are covered by this system:

- failure to meet the expectations of the uniform policy
- use of inappropriate language
- out of lesson without a pass
- failure to follow the one-way system
- use of mobile phone in the building

- inappropriate behaviour in corridors
- Inappropriate behaviour at lunchtime/break time
- chewing gum
- littering













#### St Michael's Student Voice

Student Voice allows students to share thoughts, ideas, and opinions about school life, pastoral matters, and external projects. Student Voice offers a sense of community and strength within the school and offers a wide range of opportunities within the school and the wider community. We welcome students of all ages and abilities to take part, enabling you to develop your confidence, self-esteem and initiative.

The board of members currently meet weekly during lunchtime and after school. Often students will attend activities and meetings during evenings, school holidays, and weekends depending on the project they have chosen. All projects and ideas are developed by students.

#### St Michael's Extracurricular Clubs

As part of the school community, students are actively encouraged to participate in a wide range of extracurricular activities. We offer many clubs and activities at lunchtime and after school. These include sports, art, Student Voice, Junior Leadership Teams, subject clubs, and musical groups.

Students can also participate in concerts, plays and musical performances, and dance productions. They are also expected to contribute to a range of year-group events and competitions including sports days.

We also organise a number of educational visits and residential trips. These have included: Italy, France, Germany, London, Premier League football stadiums, Alton Towers, and The Houses of Commons.











#### **House System**

At St Michael's, we have a House System with four different houses. Once you start at St Michael's, you will be informed which House you are in, and you will remain in that House throughout your time at St Michael's.

#### Rewards



Each day, students can be awarded house points as recognition for their hard work and dedication to their learning. On a weekly basis, pupils will be rewarded with a range of prizes for accumulating 5, 10, or 15 house points over the period of the previous week. Students that have regularly achieved house points and have shown excellent attendance and punctuality over the period of a term, will be invited to attend one of our big end of term awards. These have previously included trips to Alton Towers Theme Park, a Winter Ball, and an Inflatables afternoon on the school field.

Both girls and boys are equally worried about **BEING** 

**BULLIED** when starting secondary school. We take bullying very seriously at St Michael's. The best thing to do is to tell someone quickly. At St Michael's, there are a number of ways to report bullying, including our Speak Out Safely (SOS) campaign.

By the end of Year 7, students are not as worried.

As you start secondary school, you may be concerned about the **AMOUNT OF HOMEWORK** you are going to get. At St Michael's, we expect all students to use their school planner to aid their organisation.

#### Always make sure that you:

- · record all homework and due dates in your planner
- understand the instructions for the homework before you leave the lesson
- complete homework early so that you can get help if you have any problems.





At the beginning of Year 7, while they were getting to know all the rules, and different teachers, lots of students worried about

#### **DISCIPLINE** and **DETENTIONS**.

At St Michael's, you will get your values and expectation cards. This will allow you to follow our behaviour standards and instil our core values.
